- **Advance our mission** by shaping innovative interfaith experiences, including a new immersive exhibition at the Tri-Faith Center.
- **Expand our reach** through bold partnerships, compelling storytelling, and high-impact programming.

- **Elevate our voice** on the national stage as a leading model for religious pluralism and peaceful coexistence.

In partnership with the senior clergy, as the public face of the Tri-Faith Initiative, the ED will also serve as a dynamic leader and spokesperson, elevating Tri-Faith's work as a recognized model for cultivating and sustaining meaningful relationships across religious difference.
- Omaha Community Partners: The ED will represent and advocate for Tri-Faith within Omaha, acting as a key ambassador and building relationships with donors, university religion departments, and social justice organizations. Additionally, the ED will cultivate partnerships with institutions that help attract visitors and broaden the Initiative's local impact.
- National & International Networks: While the ED's initial focus will be on Omaha, the role will expand to a national and global stage, positioning Tri-Faith as a leading model for interfaith collaboration. The ED should bring or develop high-level relationships within the interfaith community. Credibility and expertise in engaging faith leaders and religious scholars will be essential, along with the ability to attract, manage, and provide resources that advance their work.

DESCRIPTION SUMMARY

The Tri-Faith Initiative (TFI) is seeking a visionary, experienced and mission-driven Executive Director (ED) to lead our nationally recognized nonprofit based in Omaha, Nebraska. The ED will provide strategic management and operational leadership, while advancing TFI's mission to foster interfaith collaboration among its three founding faith partners: Temple Israel (TI), Countryside Community Church (CCC), and the American Muslim Institute (AMI).

This is a unique opportunity to guide a one-of-a-kind organization that is both deeply rooted in the local community and increasingly influential across the nation. The ED will be responsible for advancing strategic priorities, ensuring financial sustainability, expanding community and national partnerships, and deepening TFI's impact through meaningful programming and engagement.

ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

The role of the Executive Director will include the following:

Organizational Development & Thought Leadership

- Lead the strategic development and implementation of innovative, mission-aligned programs that elevate TFI as a trusted regional, national and global leader in interfaith collaboration.
- Oversee the development of educational initiatives, public dialogues, and cross-cultural experiences that build mutual understanding among diverse faiths.
- Guide the organization's thought leadership efforts, including speaker series, academic collaborations, publications, and interfaith convenings.
- Direct media and communications strategies that articulate TFI's story, highlight its impact, and engage broad audiences.
- Cultivate partnerships with academic, cultural and faith-based institutions to expand TFI's influence and reach.



Strategic Leadership & Community Engagement

- Champion TFI's mission across the Tri-Faith Commons and greater Omaha area while building momentum for national recognition.
- Develop a comprehensive community engagement strategy that aligns with TFI's values and enhances local and national visibility.
- Strengthen relationships with the founding faith partners, and cultivate partnerships with civic, religious, and interfaith organizations facilitating meaningful dialogue, joint initiatives, and collaborative programming.
- Represent TFI as a leading voice in religious pluralism through media appearances, public events and national coalitions.
- Maintain TFI's commitment to inclusion, dialogue and shared learning while staying free from political or geopolitical pressures.

Strategic Philanthropy & Resource Development

- Lead the creation and execution of a long-term fundraising strategy in partnership with the Board and Development Committee.
- Cultivate major donors, institutional partners and foundations to secure diverse funding sources that amplifies TFI's impact.
- Deepen donor relationships through meaningful engagement, stewardship and consistent communications.
- Explore national philanthropic networks to unlock new funding opportunities.
- Ensure fundraising efforts support both programmatic innovation and operational sustainability.

Financial Management & Sustainability

- Provide fiscal oversight including budgeting, financial planning and reporting.
- Align resources with strategic objectives and ensure compliance with financial policies and best practices.
- Explore mission-aligned revenue streams such as grants, sponsorships, individuals and other innovative funding opportunities.



Corporate Governance & Board Accountability

- Collaborate closely with the Board of Directors to uphold governance, strategic direction and financial stewardship.
- Work in strong partnership with the Board Chair to prioritize strategic goals and foster transparency.
- Serve as a key liaison between the Board, staff and stakeholders, ensuring open communication and accountability.
- Organize with the Board Chair all board and executive meetings, retreats and planning sessions.
- Engage regularly with the three Tri-Faith Founding Faith Partners to ensure organizational alignment with TFI's shared mission.

Required Qualifications

- 1. Proven track record of leading and managing an organization effectively.
- 2. Experience in interfaith engagement and collaboration.
- 3. Successful history of securing foundation grants and overseeing development efforts.
- 4. Demonstrated ability to build and sustain relationships with major donors.

Preferred Qualifications

- 1. At least eight (8) years of senior leadership experience in nonprofit or mission-driven organizations.
- 2. Minimum of four (4) or more years of leading initiatives or organizations focused on interfaith, religious or social impact work.
- 3. Advanced degree preferred; however, extensive and relevant leadership experience will be considered in lieu of a degree.
- 4. Prior experience specifically leading an interfaith organization is highly desirable.

Temple Israel

Founded in 1871, Temple Israel is Omaha's Reform Jewish Congregation. With over 650 families, it is the largest Jewish congregation in the city. It has a long heritage of acclaimed Rabbinic leadership. Rabbis Aryeh Azriel and Sidney Brooks served the Congregation for roughly 60 of the last 65 years; each was a national thought leader, a rabbi to rabbis, and among the most sought-after advisers to area business and political leaders. Temple Israel has most recently welcomed in Rabbi Benjamin Sharff who has served a variety of communities throughout the country with a passion for Jewish engagement, intra-faith and interfaith work, and social justice including introducing dynamic and engaging worship and learning opportunities.

The Congregation is led by an unending series of strong and progressive clergy, lay volunteers, and participates with many other Omaha communities and organizations in the pursuit of Tzedek (justice), Teshuvah (repair), and Tikvah (hope).
